"Born and raised in Lansdowne, Pennsylvania. In high school, I worked as a stringer for The Philadelphia Inquirer and on the City Desk of the Philadelphia Daily News. I attended Temple University in Philadelphia and Bennington College in Vermont, where I studied with musicians Bill Dixon and Milford Graves. I moved to Hollywood, California in the early 1990s, and paid the rent working the counter at West Hollywood's infamous Circus of Books. From there I spent a few years as a development executive for Paramount Pictures and Warner Brothers. I am a documentary filmmaker. For a time I wrote a column for Asian Cult Cinema magazine. I've written CD liner notes for Rhino, and l've recorded critical audio commentaries for home video releases from Anchor Bay, Panik House, and others. My screenplay with Jason Cuadrado, I'm Here For You, was filmed as Devil May Call (Lionsgate).
"I founded the New Texture arts collective in the mid-2000s. I launched its website, publishing imprint, and music label soon after. I curate the imprint, and I design and edit most of its releases, including Josh Alan Friedman's Black Cracker, The Men's Adventure Library series (with Robert Deis), The Last Coloring Book series (with Jimmy Angelina) and the music of the late Reverend Raymond Branch. I publish work by Bruce Jay Friedman, Harlan Ellison, Walter Kaylin, and Robert Silverberg, as well as artists Mort Künstler, Samson Pollen, and Gil Cohen.
"I've published the monographs Dollar Halloween and I Need Real Tuxedo and a Top Hat! and the collections Buty-Wave Is Now Closed Forever and Jorge Amaya Doesn't Live Here Anymore. My pictures have appeared on covers of various book and music releases.
"The photographs in And the red death held sway over the dollar store come from time spent in California, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Alabama."
